Now Order Everything in One Place

The entire SAT Suite of Assessments—the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9—is available for you to order at ordering.collegeboard.org. You can administer multiple tests from the SAT Suite at the same time. Use the ordering site to directly manage accounts and orders of test materials, reducing time and paperwork.

Sign Up—Sign In—Order*

Test coordinators need two things:

1. An account at ordering.collegeboard.org. If you used the site last year, sign in to your account with the same username and password. If this is your first time registering, sign up for an account.
2. Your school and access codes.

RECEIVE MATERIALS EARLY

Save time by letting students fill out their identifying information before test day—choose the preadministration option at ordering.collegeboard.org. Preadministration materials are sent automatically for SAT® School Day and can be requested for PSAT/NMSQT®, PSAT™ 10, and PSAT™ 8/9.

Feb. 25– March 29	February–March testing takes place.

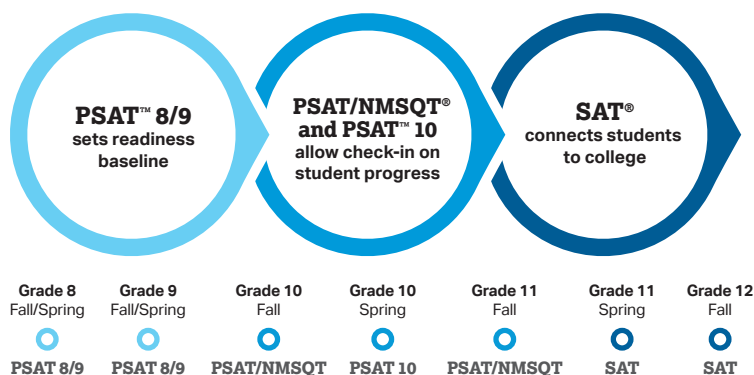

SAT Suite of Assessments

The SAT Suite of Assessments is an integrated system of tests that measure what students are learning in class and what they need to succeed in college.



Terms we use to refer to testing staff have changed.

Across College Board assessments (SAT Suite and AP®), the person managing the testing process is now called a **coordinator**. The person reading testing scripts to students is called a **proctor**. The person observing students during testing or patrolling the hallway is a **room monitor** or **hall monitor**.

SAT School Day

SAT School Day allows states, districts, and schools to offer the SAT to juniors and seniors during a weekday in their own school, expanding access to this globally recognized college admission test that's accepted at all U.S. colleges. From flexible ordering options to implementation tools, the College Board makes it easy for your school or district to administer.

Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test

The 2018 PSAT/NMSQT is the qualifying test students take to enter the National Merit® Scholarship Program and to compete for recognition and college scholarships to be awarded in 2020. (See further information under "Benefits.")

PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9

The PSAT 10 and the PSAT 8/9 each serve as a "check-in" on progress, allowing students and teachers to pinpoint areas for focused practice as students progress through high school. The PSAT 10 covers the same content areas as the PSAT/NMSQT. For both the PSAT 10 and the PSAT 8/9, schools may test on any weekday during the testing dates.

Benefits

SAT Suite

The SAT Suite of Assessments focuses on the skills and knowledge needed for college and career readiness, reflects what students are already learning in their classrooms, and provides benchmarks for assessing students' progress as they enter and move through high school.

The SAT Suite of Assessments offers unparalleled benefits to states, districts, schools, and students by:

- **Setting Benchmarks:** Uses a common score scale for a clear baseline to measure progress from year to year and focuses on areas where students need support so educators can quickly intervene.
- **Opening AP Opportunities:** Identifies students likely to succeed in AP. When students do well in AP courses, they're more likely to succeed in college. Also, students with qualifying AP Exam scores can save money through credit-granting and placement policies.
- **Increasing Access to Opportunities:** Lets schools and districts administer the SAT, and any of the assessments, during the school day. Students can take tests without worrying about weekend jobs or other obligations.
- **Providing Actionable Data:** Delivers valuable data in one online score reporting portal. Educators and students can easily view, sort, and analyze scores for the PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, and SAT Subject Tests™ all in one place to better understand results and use them to inform instruction.

FREE PRACTICE

Students who sign up for Official SAT Practice on Khan Academy® and link their College Board account get a personalized study plan based on their test results so they can focus on the skills they need to work on most. National Merit Scholarship Program

To enter the program, which is conducted by National Merit Scholarship Corporation, students must take the PSAT/NMSQT in the specified year of their high school program (usually the junior year) and meet other published participation requirements.

Information about the National Merit Scholarship Program, entry requirements, and scholarships to be offered in 2020 is explained in the *Guide to the National Merit Scholarship Program* (for educators), on NMSC's website at www.nationalmerit.org, and in the 2018 *PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide*, delivered to schools this fall.

Note: The PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9 are **not** considered for entry into the National Merit Scholarship Program. The PSAT/NMSQT is the official route of entry into the National Merit Scholarship Program.

Testing with Accommodations

All accommodations for SAT School Day, PSAT/NMSQT, and PSAT 10 must be approved by the College Board before test day. The College Board doesn't need to review accommodations for PSAT 8/9—the student's school determines these accommodations.



Ordering Accommodated Test Formats

Accommodated test formats, such as large print, braille, and MP3 audio, are available for SAT School Day, the PSAT/NMSQT, and the PSAT 10 with College Board approval. After receiving approval for your accommodation requests and consulting with your SSD coordinator, order accommodated test formats at ordering.collegeboard.org.

Scores

SAT School Day scores are available to educators on k12reports.collegeboard.org in late October and to students soon afterward. Some essay scores may be posted on a later date. (Scores for seniors aren't guaranteed to arrive in time for college early admission deadlines.)

PSAT/NMSQT scores are released to k12reports.collegeboard.org by mid-December for educators; paper reports and student reports follow shortly afterward. For PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9, the availability of online scores and interpretive materials will depend on when schools return the answer sheets. Paper score reports will be mailed soon after online scores are available.
