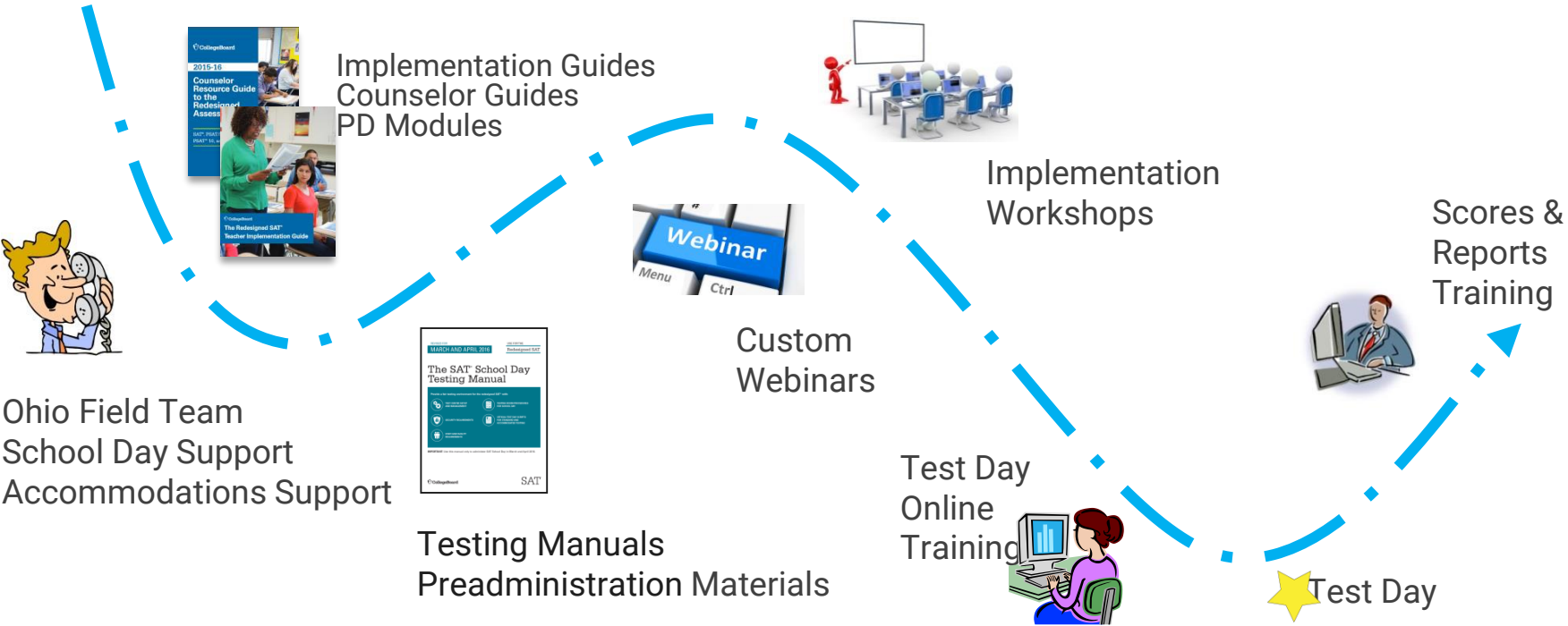

We're making it easier to administer SAT School Day based upon feedback from Ohio SAT districts.

Updates for the 2019-20 SAT School Day include:

- Additional and extended digital testing administrations
- Reduced spacing requirements for paper and digital testing
- Adjusted proctor ratios to ease staffing constraints for paper and digital testing
- Improved processes for UPS pickups

# SAT Reporting

**Online score reporting portal provides educators with actionable data!**

- 
- District, school, student level reports
  - Ability to create groups, sort by demographics, apply filters.
  - Ability to batch print:
    - Student score reports
    - Score labels
  - Question and answer analysis to inform instruction
  - Benchmarks, percentiles, and the vertical scale provides to measures to monitor student progress towards college readiness

# SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmarks

- ▶ 75% likelihood of a student achieving at least a “C” grade in a first-semester, credit-bearing college course in a related subject
- ▶ Set at Section Level
- ▶ Remediation-free standards are set at the SAT benchmarks.

# Ohio Graduation Requirements

The SAT meets the student test requirement for a college and career readiness test.

The Ohio Remediation Free Standard for the SAT was updated in May 2017. The standard is aligned to the College Board's College and Career Readiness Benchmark.

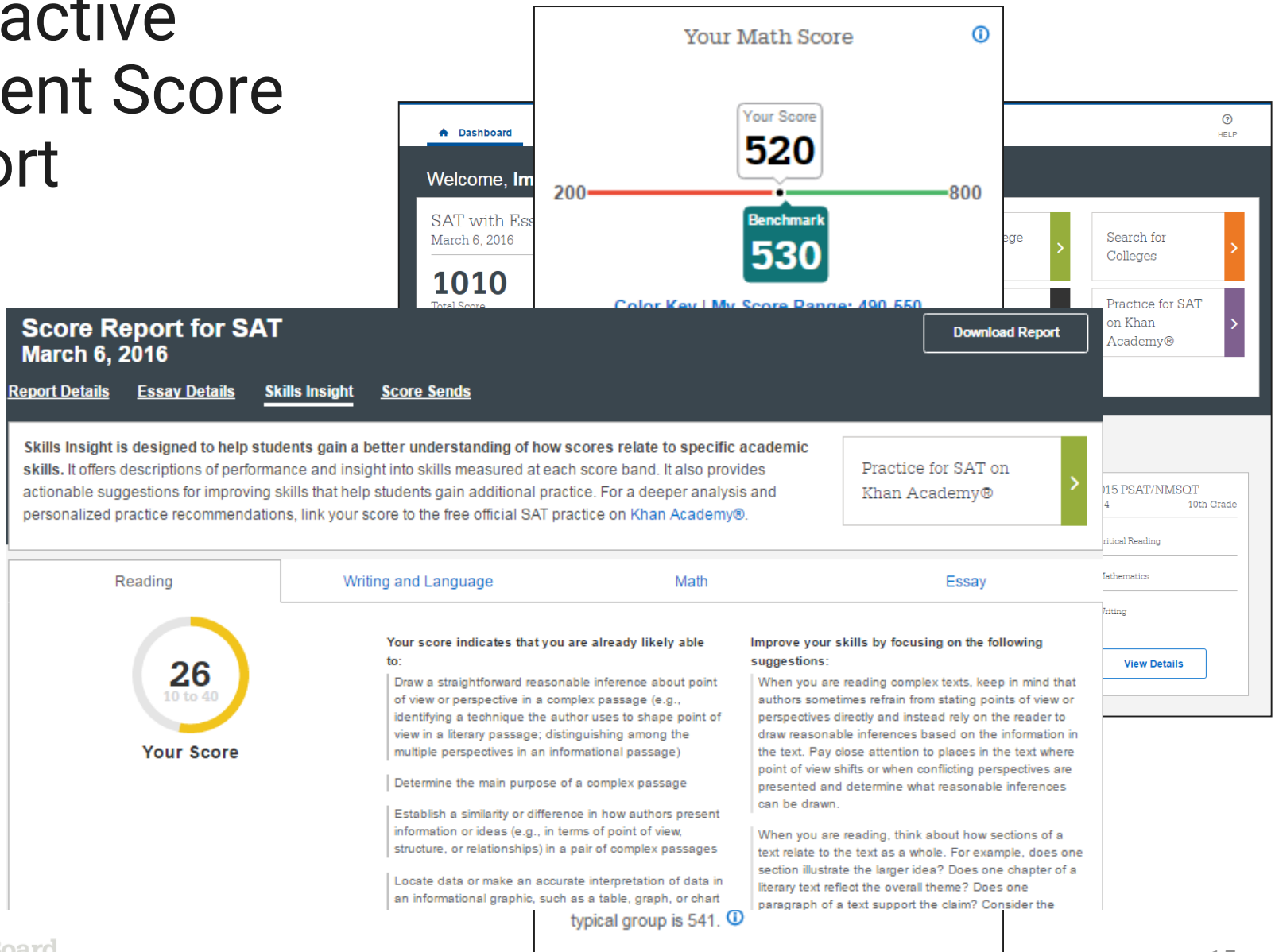

  - The [College Board Opportunity Scholarship](#) is a new program that guides students through the college planning process and offers them a chance to earn scholarships for each action they complete, including practicing for the SAT and building a college list.
    - Completing each step earns students a chance for a scholarship; completing all six actions earns students a chance to win \$40,000 for their college education.

<p><b>Option 2</b> All Digital Testing in March</p>	<p>Primary Window: March 4-6 *Accommodated Testing Window: March 4-17 Makeup Date: March 25</p>
<p><b>Option 3</b> All Paper/Pencil Testing in April</p>	<p>**Primary Date: April 14 *Accommodated Testing Window: April 14-27 Makeup Date: April 28</p>
<p><b>Option 4</b> All Digital Testing in April</p>	<p>**Primary Window: April 14-16 *Accommodated Testing Window: April 14-27 Makeup Date: April 28</p>

\* For students with certain accommodations designated to test in the accommodated testing window.

\*\*Only testing on April 14<sup>th</sup> (either on paper or digitally) is available for access to disclosed test questions in the reporting portal.

If districts choose the March 4 paper administration or March 4-6 digital window and schools will not be in session during the March 25, 2020 makeup, we can work with you to schedule another makeup date (April 28).

# Digital Testing

- Digital testing is delivered on the AIR Test Delivery System that Ohio districts are already familiar with.
  - Digital testing is available in both the March and April testing windows.
  - A district that chooses digital must administer the digital SAT to all students in the district unless a student requires paper/pencil accommodations.
- Digital testing is supported on a variety of devices: desktops, laptops, Chromebooks, and iPads.
  - NOTE: Apple iPads with 9.7” display are allowed, Apple iPads must be 4<sup>th</sup> generation or higher, and iPad Mini’s can’t be used. For security purposes, iPads are not supported for testing with assistive technology.

# Digital Testing Resources

- 
- **Digital testing portal**
    - Includes helpful resources such as guide for digital preparedness, recorded webinars and presentations, hardware and software requirements, FAQs, and electronic copies of digital testing manuals
  - **AIR's sandbox environment**
    - Includes the TA Interface Practice site with the Student Digital Test Preview which can be used together to simulate test day and get hands-on experience administering the digital tests
  - **Digital Training**
    - Includes online easy-to-follow courses for coordinators, proctors and other supporting staff

# Supports for Students with Disabilities (SSD)

**SAT is available for all students**

---

Accommodations are submitted through an online system.

- Most students who have the accommodation written into their IEP or 504 and use that accommodation for testing will be automatically approved under our submission processes.
- Students who have previously been approved for College Board accommodations do not need to resubmit. Their accommodation will apply to SAT.
- There are two types of accommodations:
  - Those that result in college reportable scores
  - Those that result in scores for students, districts, and the state, but that cannot be used for college admissions or the Ohio remediation free standard.
- Some accommodations require students to test on the primary test date. There are others that allow students to be flexibly scheduled throughout an accommodated testing window.
- More detailed information will be available from the Ohio Department of Education and College Board in the near future.

# Supports for English Learners

---

English learners will be able to utilize the following supports to obtain college reportable scores and without the need for approval for their use:

- Word-for-word bilingual glossaries
  - The list of approved glossaries has approximately 100 titles.
- Translated test directions

English learners will be able to utilize the following support to obtain college reportable scores.

- 50% extended time
